EVIDENCE OF SMALL AIRWAYS DISEASE AND THE IMMEDIATE EFFECTS OF LUMACAFTOR IVACAFTOR IN CHILDREN WITH CYSTIC FIBROSIS.....P71

Finnegan et al reviewed a cohort of 15 children with cystic fibrosis who were treated with lumacaftor/ivacaftor. They noted a transient decrease in FEV1 in 14 of the children. This decline has been attributed to bronchoconstriction.

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ORAL ANTICOAGULANTS - UTILISATION AND EXPENDITURE UNDER THE COMMUNITY DRUGS SCHEMES.....P72

Smith and Barry report that the introduction of direct oral anticoagulants (DOACs) has resulted in an increase in anticoagulant prescribing. The annual expenditure on DOACs now exceeds €51 million.

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LONG-TERM OUTCOMES OF 100 TRANSOBTURATOR TAPE PROCEDURES.....P73

Croghan et al report on 100 transobturator procedures on 100 female patients over a 5 year period. Short-term cure/significant improvement was seen in 98 cases. In the longer-term 81% stated that their urinary symptoms were much better.

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VACCINATION – A VITAL PROTECTION.....P74

McLoughlin and Carroll report a series of 40 patients with sudden sensorineural hearing loss (SSNHL). In 6 cases the SSNHL was Mumps-related, and at 3 months none showed improvement. The authors stress the importance of the MMR vaccination.

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
