Hogan-Murphy et al completed a prospective audit on insulin prescribing, administration, and glucose monitoring trends. The overall insulin error rate with one or more errors comprising prescribing and/or administration per inpatient drug record was 90% (37)

Healy et al point out that procedural intervention beds are an important resource. There is a clear age divide. For those under 65 years, the bed days per procedure as 17 days. For those over 65 years, the bed days per procedure was 48 days.

[Hurling Related Blunt Laryngeal Trauma](#)

Gillanders et al describe 21 hurling and camogie players who suffered laryngeal trauma. The commonest presentation was hoarseness. All of the cases had laryngeal tenderness on palpation. Three players had thyroid cartilage fracture and one player required a tracheostomy.
