### How can we improve retention of doctors

Fox et al report on a survey of 149 medical students and their career intentions. Half intend to pursue a medical specialty. 68% rated lifestyle/work as important. 73% rated the positive experience of a clinical post.

# A mixed methods study of attendance and treatment rates among patients with Hepatitis C

Nic an Riogh et al have analysed the clinic attendance patterns of 96 patients with Hepatitis C. There was a total of 500 clinic attendances. Thirty one per cent of patients commenced treatment during the study period. Barriers to treatment were competing priorities, fear of treatment, misinformation, and denial.

### Medium Chain Acyl-CoA Dehydrogenase Deficiency: 3 years of newborn screening

Howard et al report on their experience of the neonatal screening programme for MCAD. Eleven babies with MCAD were identified. This incidence is higher than had been predicted.

# 'It's time to act FAST: A quality improvement program (QIP) to improve acute stroke imaging times'

Doran et al describe a quality improvement project to reduce the time to imaging in patients with a stroke. The mean interval time was reduced from 32.9 mins to 22.08 mins Multiple sources of pain in patients attending chronic pain clinics

Harmon et al report on a survey of 300 patients attending chronic pain clinics. The study indicates that 63% attending chronic pain clinics have multiple sources of pain.

# An evaluation of dietary intake, quality, and adherence to WCRF/AICR recommendations in a cohort of cancer survivors

Kavanagh et al report on the dietary profiles of 35 patients with cancer. The authors found that the diet quality in the cohort was low with a healthy diet indicator of 3.3. The Mediterranean diet score is 5.9

A Pelvic Osteotomy programme in a stand-alone orthopaedic centre: an early service evaluation

Brady et al report on 54 children who had a pelvic osteotomy for developmental dysplasia of the hip. The median age of the children was 4 years. None of the children needed a paediatric review.
