Survey of patient attitudes of face-to-face and telemedicine teaching in COVID-19 Coady et al. surveyed 229 inpatient and outpatients. They had a positive attitude towards both face-to-face and telemedicine teaching. However they preferred the former.	848
Supraclavicular flap reconstruction in head and neck surgery during the SARs-CoV-2 pandemic Walsh et al. describe 5 patients who underwent supraclavicular pedicled flap reconstruction for cancer. The accompanying clinical photographs clearly depict the stages of the procedure.	849
Oral and dental symptoms in acute hospital specialist palliative care Cassidy et al. studied the dental findings in 50 patients receiving palliative care. The common symptoms were dry mouth and oral pain.	850
Cold water swimming and its potential health benefits: a qualitative study of participants' views and experiences Flynn et al. found that in a survey of cold water swimmers there were 3 main themes. They were transforming mood, physical wellbeing, and community engagement.	851

<p>Enhancing the Quality of External Referrals to Thoracic Surgery in a Tertiary Referral Centre</p> <p>Davey et al. report that the use of a standardised referral proforma improved the quality of patient referral data content from 63% to 93%.</p>	853
<p>Introducing LISA: Less Invasive Surfactant Administration</p> <p>Duff et al. describe their NICU experience in the use of LISA in the administration of surfactant to preterm infants with RDS. The technique is outlined including the role of the video laryngoscope.</p>	854
<p>A loop closure Audit on Quality of Handover for Patient care to the Post-Anaesthetic Care Unit (PACU)</p> <p>Hassan and Ali found that following their audit there was an improvement in post anaesthesia handover communication.</p>	855
<p>Genetic knowledge, experience and educational needs of paediatric trainees in Ireland</p> <p>Quinn et al. surveyed paediatric trainees about their knowledge of genetic testing and its interpretation. Forty one per cent stated that they had a poor understanding of genetic tests while the rest had a fair understanding. The authors conclude that further training is needed.</p>	856
<p>Sepsis and documentation of six physiological vital signs in GP Out-of-Hours</p> <p>Hayes et al. examined records to check for the documentation of the 6 physiological signs in 4872 GP out-of-hours cases. Mental state was noted 100% of cases, temperature in 69%, blood pressure in 24%, heart rate in 23%, oxygen saturation in 13%, respiratory rate in 8%, and all 6 signs in 1.7% of cases.</p>	857

<p>The impact of the South Kerry CAMHS review and Maskey report on child and adolescent psychiatrists' work motivation and stress levels</p> <p>Bond and McNicholas surveyed the opinions of 102 psychiatrists on their response to above report. The sentiments expressed included decrease in motivation, and increased stress levels.</p>	858
<p>Role of accompanist in pain medicine consultations: the patient perspective</p> <p>Boros et al. report on a study of 100 adult patients accompanied by companions during consultations at three hospital Pain Medicine clinics. The companions were mostly close relatives and they were there to help the patient to remember what the doctor said and to provide emotional and mobility support.</p>	859
