Radiological staging and surveillance imaging of high risk cutaneous malignant melanoma in the Mid-West of Ireland Rafferty et al. report on 310 patients with invasive malignant melanoma. The authors found that their current management was in compliance with NICE guidelines.	868
The role of physiotherapy in Muscular Dystrophies: an online survey of physiotherapists  Moran et al. undertook a questionnaire of 43 physiotherapists about their management of patients with Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy. The main focus of their management was mobility, respiratory, and aid provision.	869
Review of neonatal outcomes following new blood transfusion guidelines  Urbaniak et al. audited the response to a new neonatal transfusion guideline. There was a 56% adherence leading to fewer blood transfusions.	870
Adolescents with Type 1 Diabetes and the Paediatrics Diabetes Clinic  Dockery et al. describe 74 adolescents with type 1 diabetes, 20 being high-risk. The high-risk patients were less likely to use insulin pumps, and continuous glucose monitoring. They were more likely to have lipohypertrophy.	871

Stankiewicz and Sheehan audited medical record keeping before and after an education session. There was improvement across a number of criteria including legibility 8.35 vs 82.8%, clarity 64% vs 92%, printed names 25% vs 53%.	
The outcome of trisomy 18 pregnancies following the legalisation of termination of pregnancy	873
Miremberg et al. report that since the introduction of the TOP act there have been 47 trisomy 18 pregnancies. In almost two thirds of cases 28/47, a TOP was performed.	
EM and Me: Near-Peer Mentoring in an Emergency Department	874
Heffernan and O'Dowd describes the practice of near-peer (registrar) mentoring of junior doctors. In the programme there were 33 junior doctors and 13 mentors. The exercise was found to be beneficial.	
A review of prostate cancer prevalence among patients referred to Rapid Access Prostate Clinics with abnormal digital rectal examination in the community	875
Cullivan et al. have evaluated the role of digital rectal examination (DRE) in the community and at a prostate clinic. They found that an abnormal DRE at the clinic was more likely to detect prostate cancer compared with an abnormal DRE detected in the community.	
Women's views on the impact of the Sláintecare consultant contract on private obstetric care	876
Whelan et al. surveyed 251 women about obstetric care. The most important factor in choosing care was seeing the same consultant at every visit and having a consultant known to the patient at the delivery.	
Trends in in-hospital admissions due to dog bites in Ireland from 2012-2021	877
Ryan et al. report that there have been 3,158 emergency hospital admissions following a dog bite. The highest rate was in children. The common injuries were open wounds and fractures.
