Bruno and Sharif describe a study of 97 patients who had a percutaneous coronary intervention. They found that same-day discharge was safe in selected cases if there are no complications in the first 6 hours after the procedure.	
The effects of a range of treatment modalities on pain symptoms and overall health in women attending an endometriosis clinic	909
Treacy et al. studied 162 women with endometriosis. Following the use of a range of interventions at the clinic, the patients reported a reduction in pain symptoms.	
Frostbite injuries from recreational nitrous oxide use	910
Murphy et al. describe 7 cases of frostbite injury following recreational use of nitrous oxide. The injury is due to the spillage of the liquified gas on the skin.	
Barriers and enablers to prenatal population screening for critical congenital cardiac disease	911
Cody et al. report that in 2021, 18/19 maternity units offered a midtrimester scan, and 17/19 units provided a first-trimester scan. The authors state that the services would be improved by the introduction of critical congenital heart disease screening.	
Effect of the Covid-19 pandemic on breast cancer presentation - a single unit study over 5 years	912
Butt et al. analysed all cases of breast cancer between 2017 and 2021. The yearly number of cases was higher in the pandemic, 378 vs 332 per year. There were also higher rates of locally advanced and fungating disease.

Trends in Paediatric Emergency Medical Presentations	913
Baky et al. describe the annual attendance numbers in a large paediatric ED department during the period 2017-2022. There was a significant decrease in 2019-2020 and a subsequent increase in 2021. Among the sub-categories, there was an increase in mental health problems.	
A Video Analysis of Helmet Area Injuries and Helmet Type Worn in Hurling and Camogie Over 2 Seasons  Nolan et al. report that there were 129 potential hurling injuries across 56 games, 86% involved a non-standard helmet. There were 7 potential camogie injuries and 43% involved non-standard helmets. The authors urge the GAA to enforce the use of standard helmets.	914

McErlean et al. report on a series of patients with atrial fibrillation who were on anticoagulants. Male patients were more likely to be on the correct dose compared with female patients.

Al Nafisse et al. describe the recurrence of a liposarcoma on the posterior pharyngeal wall of a 65 year old male patient.	
Anti-NMDA receptor encephalitis presenting as aseptic meningitis	917
Joyce et al. present a case of anti-NMDA frontal lobe syndrome that initially presented as aseptic meningitis. There was a good response to IV methylprednisolone and immunoglobulins.	
Gallbladder rupture following blunt trauma	918
Rana et al. describe a 34 year old woman who sustained a ruptured gall-bladder while dancing with her husband. Both fell with the man falling on top of her. She required an open cholecystectomy.
