Mohamed and Torreggiani describe the MRI changes in 2 cases of subacute combined degeneration of the cord due to nitrous oxide misuse. Nitrous oxide causes a functional B12 deficiency.

Low Yield of Urgent Haemoptysis Referrals for Lung Cancer Clinics	1044
Quigley et al. report that among a cohort of 104 patients referred with a haemoptysis , 9 had lung cancer. The authors discuss the current investigation pathways.	
Crying out over spilt milk: Quantifying formula milk waste in a large maternity hospital	1045
Hannon et al. state that 4.7 L of infant milk formula is discarded each day at their hospital. This equates to over €12,000.00 annually. The authors suggest that the ready-to-use bottles could be reduced from 70 mls to 40-50 mls.

RSV Burden on Ireland's Tertiary Children's Hospitals: An In-Depth Winter 2023/2024 review	1047
Ali et al. report on the impact of RSV infections on infants and children last winter between October '23 to January '24. There were 869 RSV positive cases across Crumlin and Temple Street hospitals, 712 (ward) and 157 ICU. Fifty five per cent of cases were less then 6 months old. There was an associated 61% reduction in elective surgery admissions.	
Assessing the quality of transurethral resection of bladder tumour (TURBT) operation notes in line with EAU guidelines	1048
Kenny et al. have assessed the quality of operation notes in a series of 164 TURBT cases. They recommend the introduction of a standard checklist to improve documentation.	
The Prevalence of Burnout in Healthcare Workers Presenting to Occupational Health	1049
O'Brien et al. state that among 50 healthcare workers, 70% stated that they had burnout. The authors stress the role off occupational health physicians in providing support for affected employees.	
A one year analysis of e-scooter injuries: more than half require specialist follow-up	1050
Rigney et al. report on 105 cases of e-scooter injuries over a 12-month period. Fifty per cent required specialist orthopaedic care. Two cases suffered an intracranial haemorrhage. The authors state that e-scooters are not a form of transport without risk.

The use and benefit of venous blood lactate in ambulatory patients attending the Emergency Department	1051
Phelan et al. have assessed the role of lactate levels in the ED. Among 102 patients, there were 20 patients with a lactate >1.9mmol/L. The authors did not find a correlation between blood lactates and admission rates.	
Assessment of a pilot pathway redirecting low acuity emergency department patients	1052
Ipati et al. describe a pathway of redirecting low acuity patients to a local GP practice. A total of 175 patients were transferred with just 10	



patients returning to the ED within 28 days. The programme appears to be safe and effective.

The conservative management of a perforated duodenal ulcer in a morbidly obese patient	1053
Gilkinson et al. describe a case of a perforated duodenal that was successfully managed in a patient with a high BMI. The treatment consisted of antibiotics and IR guided drainage.	
Ectopic pregnancy with levonorgestrel-releasing intrauterine device (Jaydess) in situ	1054
Babiker et al. report a case of ectopic pregnancy in a patient with a LNG-IUD in situ. The authors state that in patients with an IUD there needs to increased awareness about the risk of an ectopic pregnancy.	
Maternal Diaphragmatic Hernia in Pregnancy and Gastric Herniation and Ischaemia	1055
Clifford et al. describe a spontaneous diaphragmatic hernia in a 29 week gestation mother. It was successfully repaired with laparoscopic surgery. She subsequently delivered a healthy baby at 35 weeks gestation by caesarean section.	
Acute Methaemoglobinaemia following ingestion of amyl nitrite	1056
O'Gorman et al. describe a case of methaemoglobinaemia following the ingestion of amyl nitrite (poppers). The patient responded to expectant management and did not require methylene blue.	
Fungal splenic abscess secondary to bariatric tourism in an immunocompetent patient	1057
Keane et al. describe the complication of a fungal splenic abscess in a patient following a gastric sleeve replacement in Turkey. She was treated with ultrasound guided aspiration and intravenous antifungal medication.
