<p>Improving safety in regional anaesthesia– adopting the NRFit™ system</p> <p>Moore and Narayanan describe the safety features of the NRFit connection system for regional and neuraxial anaesthesia. The device makes it virtually impossible to inadvertently attach it to a standard luer connection.</p>	69

<p>Exploring healthcare professionals' experiences when communicating with pregnant patients about stillbirth</p> <p>Rutherford et al. found that healthcare professionals find it challenging to discuss stillbirth risk factors with patients particularly maternal weight and illicit drug use.</p>	70
<p>Dilated ducts with or without raised LFTs</p> <p>Parihar et al. reviewed a series of 404 patients with dilated pancreaticobiliary ducts (PD). In 57% of cases an underlying pathology was discovered and this more likely when laboratory tests including bilirubin or AKLP were raised.</p>	71
<p>Characteristics of serious incident management team (SIMT) reviews in maternity units</p> <p>O'Connor et al. have reviewed the role and function of the SIMT in the review of perinatal deaths. The authors recommend that the reviews should more standardised, more coordinated, and more timely.</p>	72

<p><b>Endometrial cancer prevalence in women with an incidental finding of thickened endometrium</b></p> <p>Stokes et al. have reviewed 94 cases of incidentally observed increased endometrial thickness, the finding being benign in 91.5% of patients. The implications are discussed.</p>	73
<p><b>Low dose intrathecal morphine for total knee replacement</b></p> <p>Ballantine and Gogarty describe the provision of post-operative pain relief following total knee replacement in 100 patients using intrathecal morphine. The authors found it to be safe, the only common side-effect being urinary retention which occurred in 15 patients.</p>	74
<p><b>Social Deprivation among Children with Inherited Metabolic Disorders</b></p> <p>Reaney et al. state that 21.5% of children with a metabolic disorder live in a deprived area compared with 3.8% of the general population. In addition, 12.5% are from the traveller community.</p>	75
<p><b>Rapid Radiological imaging and its Impact on Patient Experience and Length-of-Stay in the Acute Medicine Unit</b></p> <p>Cuddihy et al. demonstrate the value of rapid radiology in reducing the wait times in AMUs.</p>	76
<p><b>Delivery Trends After Obstetric Anal Sphincter Injuries</b></p> <p>Rotem et al. compared the delivery patterns in two time periods 2007-2012, 2018-2022, for women in the subsequent pregnancy after a previous obstetric anal sphincter injury. Over the two time periods the caesarean section rate increased from 37% to 56.6%.</p>	77
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
